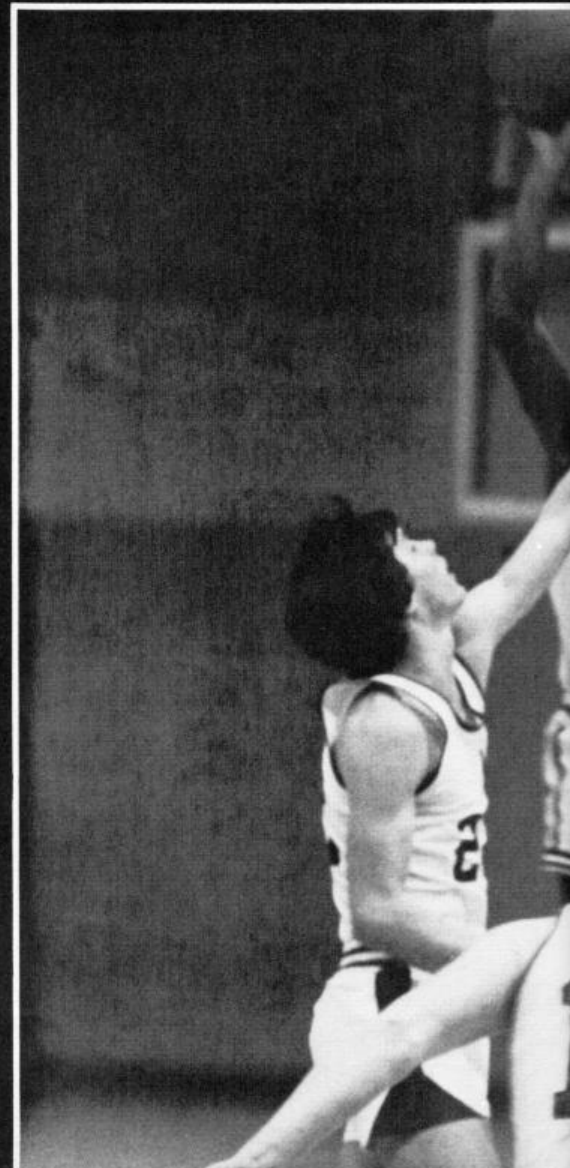
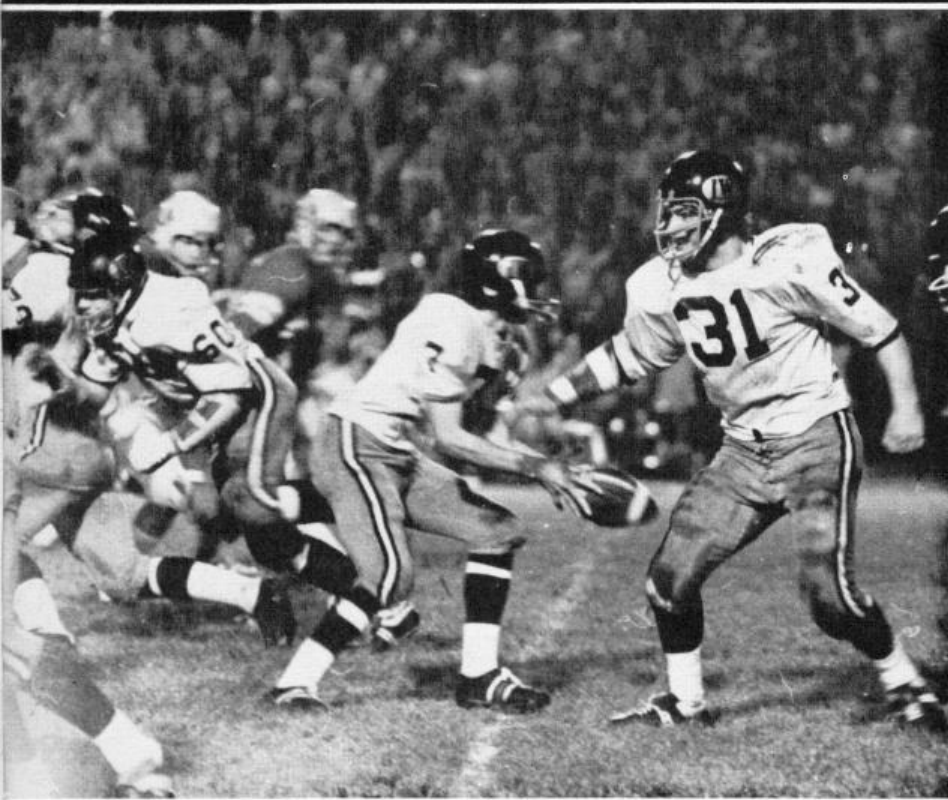
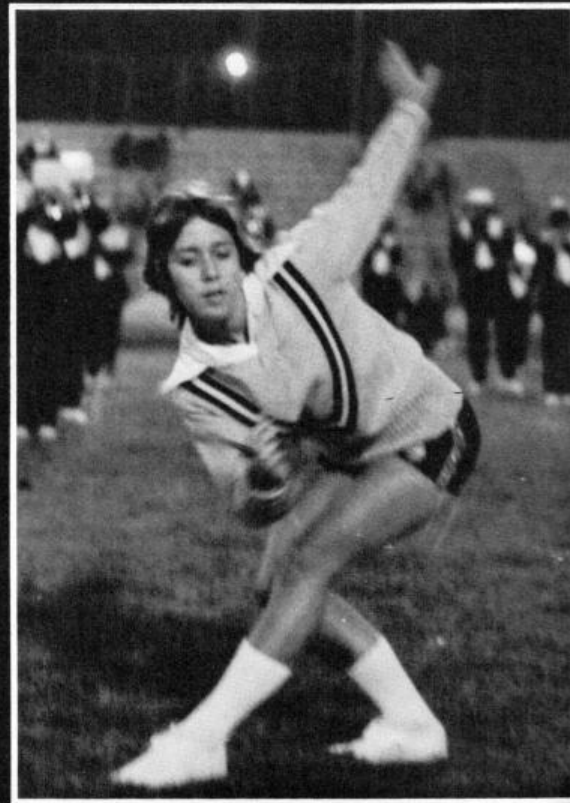
## *“ . . . We find ourselves alone again . . . ”*

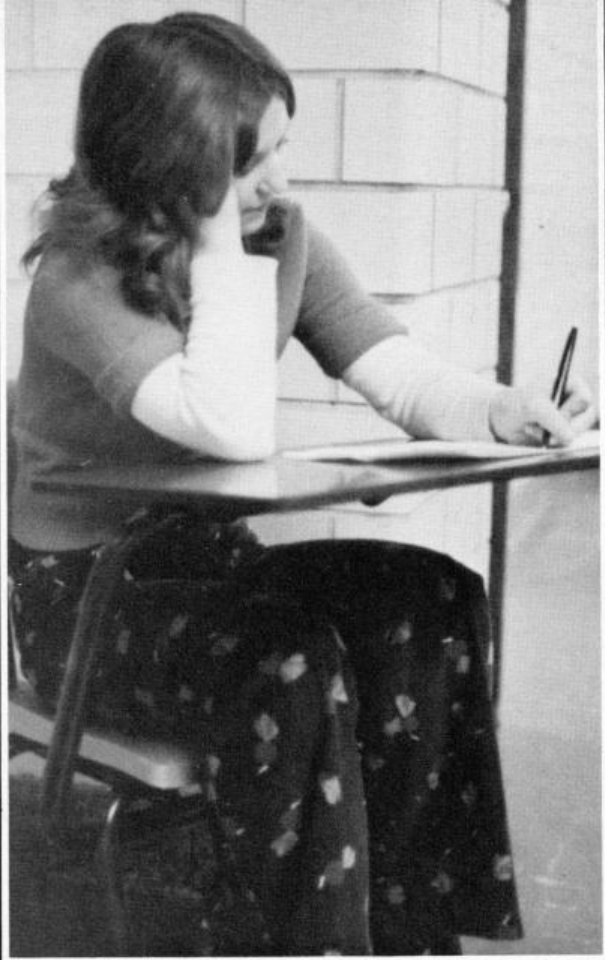
